Our College

Kandaswami Kandar's College

The strength of a nation depends on great individuals. Sri. Sankara Kandaswami Kandar's life, ideals, and service had a significant impact on the annals of his birth place Nanjai Edayar (in the Namakkal District of Tamilnadu), and the surrounding areas. He felt the need to provide education to the poor. As a result Kandaswami Kandar Charitable Trust Board was registered under Society Registration Act. A School was taken over in 1925. In 1945, elementary school was transformed into a secondary school.

Sri.M.Parimala Kandar, President of the Trust, and Sri.M.Rathinasabapathy, Correspondent, desired to carry on Sri. Kandaswami Kandar's noble mission. They found a college in Velur for the poor students who were unable to afford higher education at Salem, Trichy, Chidambaram and Chennai.

When Sri. K. Kamaraj, was the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, in 1962, the University of Madras affiliated our college initially for Pre-University Courses and subsequently for Degree Courses in Arts and Science Subjects.

Sri C.N. Annadurai, the then-chief minister of Tamil Nadu, inaugurated the institution in 1967. In 1971, postgraduate classes commenced. Our research facilities have been accredited by the University of Madras with PhD courses to the rural college. The College has UGC 2(f) accreditation.

In 1998, it came under the affiliation of Periyar University in Salem. The institution now has 48 acres of verdant vegetation and every facility. The region's poor and oppressed have received excellent education. The College offers 17 postgraduate and 14 graduate programs. Ten out of thirteen research departments offer M.Phil and PhD degrees.

Our faculties have published 900 research articles and 52 books. It has completed 35 minor research projects. It periodically conducts Inter National, National and State Level Seminars, workshops and conferences funded by reputable organizations.

ICT-enabled classrooms, a well-stocked automated library, a Modern English Language Laboratory, well-equipped laboratories, computer labs, an internet café, a wifi campus, an auditorium, a seminar hall, playgrounds, indoor stadium, fitness center, a canteen, ramp and a wheelchair for students with disabilities and a student store all contribute to a conducive academic environment.

Smt. Kuppayammal Womens Hostel, named after the wife of our founder, provides women with free and subsidized lodging and sustenance. Over five hundred deserving women have benefited. .

The college provides opportunity to join in NCC Army. (1 SD, 1 SW,) and NCC Air Wing, NSS, YRC, Cini club, Reading Club, Science Circle, Fine arts club, Eco Club etc for dynamic growth.

The All India Best Cadet Award was given to one of our NCC recruits by Sri Atal Bihari Vajpayee. The Republic Day parade in New Delhi included a female cadet from our college. Our college NSS units have been active for decades.

Sri Mohan Kumaramangalam, Sri Rangarajan Kumaramangalam, and Sri P.Chidambaram, among other notable leaders and intellectuals, have visited our campus. Our campus has hosted debates under Thavathiru Kundrakudi Adigalar, Kirubananda Warrior, and former Tamilnadu Chief Minister Kalignar M. Karunanidhi. Dr. Mayilsamy Annadurai, director of the Mangalyan Project and space scientist, and other international scientists interacted with college students.

The college is proud of its alumni who have served the country in important positions at prestigious universities at

various disciplines. Our Alumni Dr.M.Kalanithi Dr. M.Thangaraj, Dr.P.Thangaraj, and Murugesu Boopathi werehold the post of the Vice Chancellors in Anna University Chennai, Periyar University, Salem, Veterinary University, Chennai, and Tamilnadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore, respectively. Justices R.Pongiappan and Rajamanikam servedat the High Court in Chennai. Dr.S.Thangavelu was a scientist at the Indian Institute of Science in Bangalore, Dr.K. Balachandran was the head of the mathematics department at Bharathiyar Universityin Coimbatore, Mr.P.Kannappan was the Inspector General of Police for the state of Tamil Nadu, and Dr.Jambulingam Natesan was a NASA scientist.

The College received 3rd Cycle B accreditation from the NAAC in 2018. The institution celebrated its Diamond Jubilee in 2022. The vision of one man has improved the lives of many families. Sri Sankara Kandaswami Kandar partially attained his objective. Dr.R.Somasundaram, M.D., the current president, is responsible for the institution's swift growth. He strives hard to achieve the founder's ambitious goals.

**CODES TO BE FOLLOWED BY STUDENTS IN
THE COLLEGE CAMPUS**

1. Every student from the day of joining the college till the end of their studies shall act in compliance with the college rules in accordance with the undertaking made by them along with their parents at the time of joining the college. Students who violate these rules will be subject to disciplinary action.
2. Students are prohibited from using mobile phones inside the college campus.
3. Every student should wear their college identity card inside the college campus.
4. The identity card should be shown when asked by the faculties or college office staff.
5. Students must keep the ID card till the end of their studies in this college.
6. In the university examination, hall ticket along with ID card must be kept by the students.

WARNING TO STUDENTS ABOUT RAGGING

1. Ragging means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution.
2. Such illegal and disgusting activities carried out by students in the name of ragging affect other students psychologically.
3. Students involved in such activities will be suspended immediately and the decision of the head of the institution is final.
4. If the senior students who are studying in the college are ragging the new students coming to study in the first year, those students will be punished with two years of rigorous imprisonment and a fine of up to Rs.10,000 according to the Tamil Nadu Ragging Act.
5. And students who are indulging in ragging will be expelled from the college as punishment and will not be admitted to any other college for any reason.

General Rules

Attendance and Leave

The certificate allowing the student to sit for the University Examination will not be issued unless the student has earned 75% of the attendance for the semester. College attendance is mandatory, and absences will only be excused for genuine reasons beyond the candidate's control. The appeal must be submitted to the Registrar of Periyar University, Salem, along with a Rs.500/- challan.

Scholarships under Government Schemes, Merit, Backward, Most Backward Class, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe are available to UG and PG students. To qualify for the scholarship, the applicant must have 90 percent attendance.

Normally, the academic year for classes will begin in June. The academic year will be divided into two semesters of 90 working days each. Thus, the academic year will comprise of approximately 180 days.

Students are expected (a) to attend the college regularly every working day throughout the academic year, (b) to give written notice to the principal of every absence together with the reason therefor (c) wherever possible to obtain prior permission from the principal for absence.

In all possible circumstances, a leave of absence should be requested beforehand. Illness will not be accepted as a valid excuse unless the absentee provides a medical certificate issued by a licensed physician stating that he was unable to attend college on the day or days in question.

The calculation of absences during class hours will occur on a monthly basis, where a total of 5 hours will be considered equivalent to a full day of absence, while 3 hours or less will be considered as a half-day of absence.

Note*

1. Students requesting medical leave must submit a certificate from a licensed medical professional.
2. A leave letter must be submitted to the principal through the class instructor in advance; if this is not possible, the leave letter must be submitted upon the student's return to school.
3. The name of any pupil absent without permission for more than seven days will be removed from the attendance list.
4. The calculation of absences during class hours in a given month will be based on the total number of hours attended. 5 hours will constitute a full day's absence, while 3 hours or less will be considered a half-day's absence.
5. The absence of a student without permission will be counted as an hour to a half-day. One day to two days of leave.

Rules for discontinuation and Re-Enrolment in College:

1. In case of discontinuation of studies in an academic year, university permission must be obtained for re-admission in the next academic year. To get university permission applies with bank draft for discontinuation fees of Rs. 500.

(*Subject to change by the University)

2. Those who wish to join this college from another college of the same university have to take demand draft of Rs. 900 for both change of college and re-admission.
3. Those who wish to join this college from another university should obtain and submit the "Migration certificate" from the university where the college is affiliated to.

Details of Tuition Fee Concession:

The Periyar Nagammai Women's Free Education Scheme has been in operation since 1989 for children of parents with an annual income of up to Rs 50,000.

Students receiving fee concession under E.V.R Periyar Nagammaiyar scheme, in case of discontinuation of their studies in midway, the entire amount given through the concession must be repaid in one installment.

Backward Classes or Most Backward Classes whose income does not exceed Rs.2 lakh per annum are eligible for the scholarship. All Adhi Dravidians and Tribals whose income does not exceed Rs.2 lakh per annum are also eligible for the scholarship.

Students applying for these concessions should obtain a certificate from anyone of them which is Revenue Department or an officer not below the rank of Sub-Tahsildar, Sub-Judge or Gazetted Officer

Library

1. The library is open on all working days from 9.45 am to 4 pm
2. Every student will be given a library card to get a book from the library and by giving that card Students can get the book.
3. Students should stick their photo on the library card

4. Every student should submit an application to the librarian by 9:45 AM to get a book from the library. Between 2 PM and 3.30 PM Students can collect the book they want from the library assistant on submitting the library card. A book borrowed from the library should not be kept for more than seven days. If need arises, students need to renew once again.

5. Books should be handled carefully and returned in the same condition. If the pages are damaged or lost in the textbooks, five times the cost of the textbooks will be charged.
6. If the book is not handed in by the date mentioned in the reference slip, a fine of Rs.25 paise per day will be charged.
7. Library card should be kept carefully. Anyone who misses it should report it to the librarian immediately. You can also get a new library card by paying a fine of five rupees.
8. Newspapers and monthly magazines should be read only in the library. Also they must not tear pictures or pages from the weekly magazines for their own use.
9. Students can use Internet Lab Facility with prior permission.

Hostel Rules and Regulations

Introduction

The hostel is operated with rules and regulations in the best interest of the education and general welfare of the students.

Admission

- The hostel admission application form must be filled out, signed, and submitted by the student's parent or guardian at the time of admission to the college.
- Students will be admitted subject to the hostel rules and regulations.

Fees

- The following fees will be collected from each student at the time of admission to the hostel:

○ Admission fee:	₹100
○ Caution deposit:	₹1000
○ Half rent and other expenses:	₹6000
Total:	₹7100

Management

- A steering committee will be constituted for the hostel.
- Any decision of the Principal, the Deputy Warden of the hostel, and the committee regarding the hostel will be final.

Food

- Hostel food timings must be strictly followed.
- Guests are not allowed to stay or eat in the hostel.
- If a student goes on continuous leave for several days, food fee concession will be given only from the sixth day onwards. No concession is available for leave of less than five days.
- Food fee must be paid by the 20th of each month. If the payment is delayed, a fine of ₹100 per day will be levied.

Discipline

- Students who violate the rules will be suspended from the hostel.
- The action taken by the Warden and Deputy Warden of the hostel in this regard is final.

Additional Notes

- The hostel has a strict curfew in place.
- Students are not allowed to use any electrical appliances in the hostel without the permission of the authorities.
- Smoking and drinking are strictly prohibited in the hostel premises.
- Students must maintain cleanliness in their rooms and common areas.
- Students must respect the hostel staff and fellow students.
