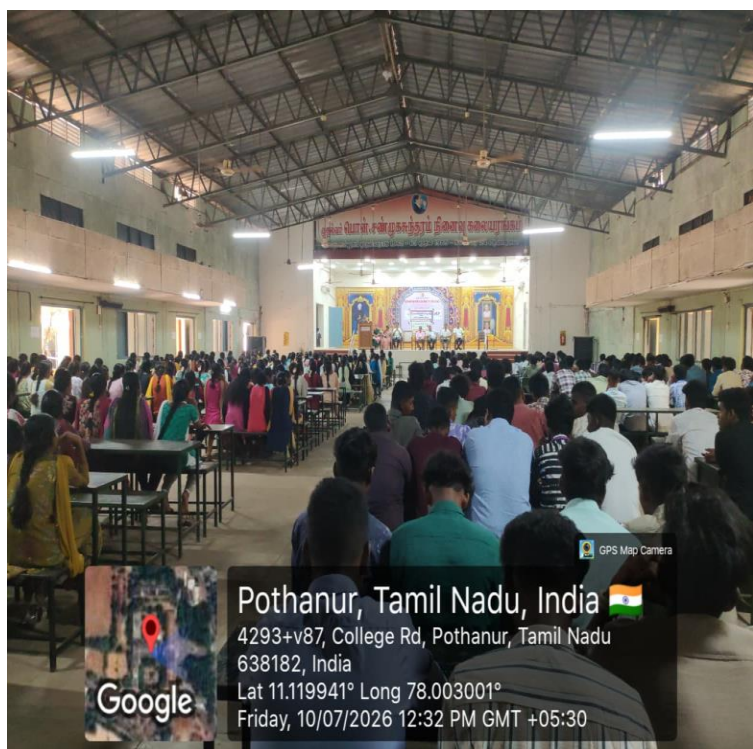


REPORT ON WOMEN SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMME

The **Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)**, **National Service Scheme (NSS)**, **Youth Red Cross (YRC)**, and **Red Ribbon Club (RRC)** of Kandaswami Kandar's College, Velur, jointly organized a **Women Safety Awareness Programme** on **10 July 2026** at the **College Auditorium**. The programme aimed to create awareness among students on **women's safety, prevention of sexual harassment, anti-ragging, anti-drug initiatives, and the importance of maintaining a safe and respectful campus environment**.

The programme commenced with a prayer followed by the welcome address delivered by **Dr. P. The resource session was delivered by **Dr. S. Parvathi**, Associate Professor and Head, Department of Economics, and **Chairperson of the Internal Complaints**

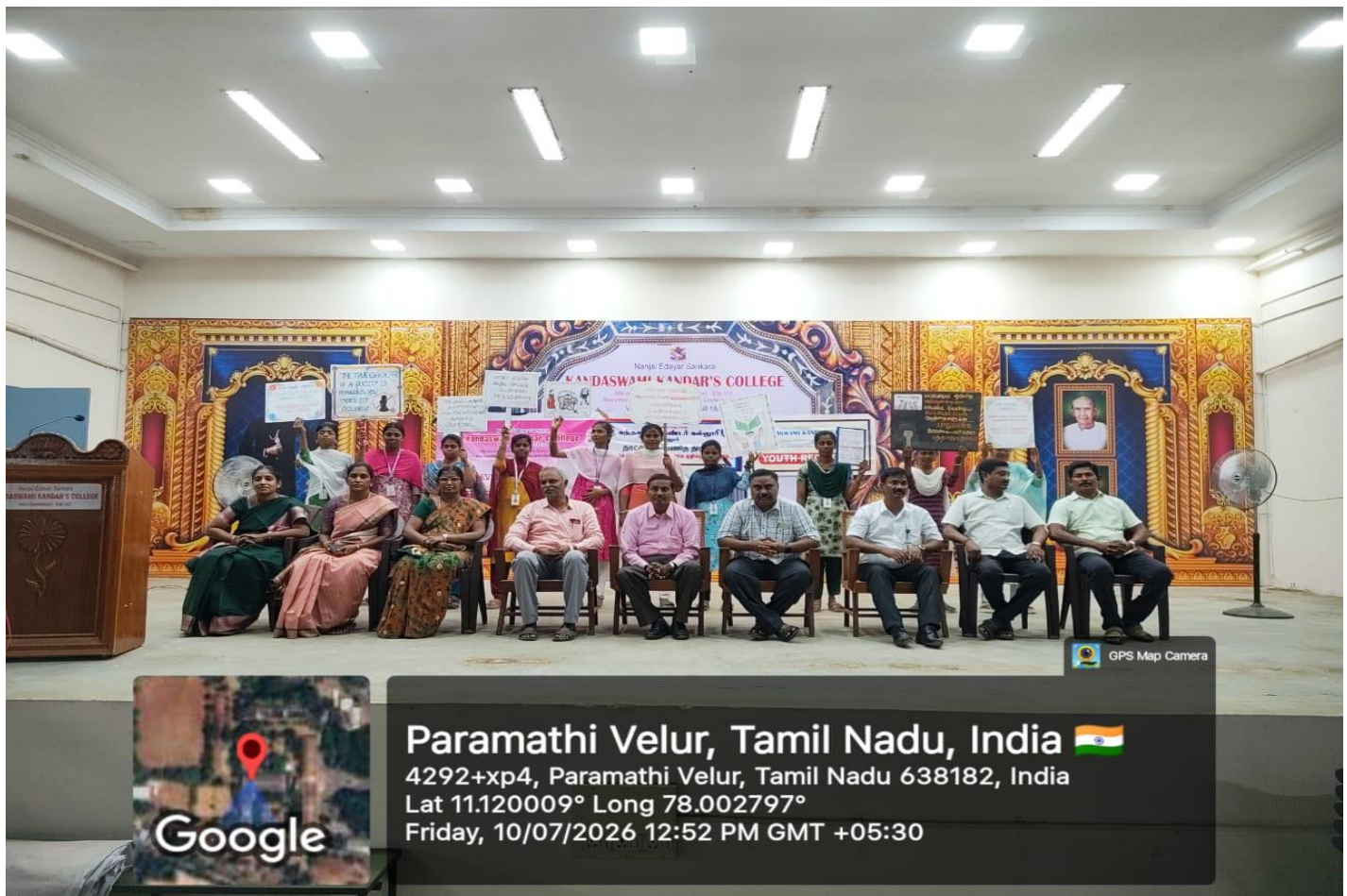
